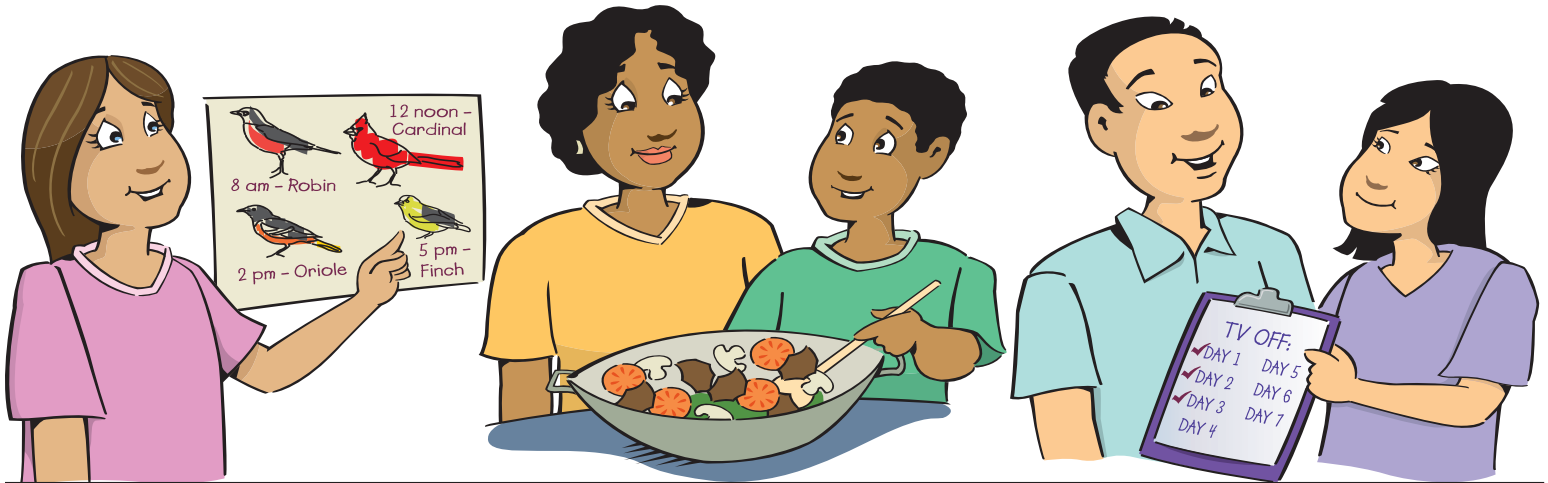

1 Celebrate April Fool's Day. Do something silly with your child.	2 Do a crossword puzzle with your child. Or make up your own to review spelling words.	3 April is Math Education Month. Take time to review math with your child each day this month.	4 Look through magazines and newspapers with your child for 90° angles. Create a collage of these angles.	5 Check on your child's grades. If necessary, help him raise them before the year ends.	6 Have your child interview people in various careers that interest her. What would a typical day be like?	7 Have your child listen to different types of music. Ask him to describe how it makes her feel.
8 Have your child design a new cover for a much-loved book.	9 Ask your child if she has ever been bullied in school. If he has, be sure to alert the school.	10 Have your child go through his toys. Are there any that he doesn't use? Give to another child, a day care center or a school!	11 Brainstorm how your family could help beautify your neighborhood.	12 At bedtime tonight, tell your child a story about yourself at her age.	13 Practice division. Ask your child, "How many of your lifetimes has Grandma lived? Aunt Sue?"	14 Have everyone in the family spend a ½ hour picking up the house. Many hands make light work.
15 Go through your cupboards. List all the foods that are grown in other countries. Find these countries on a map.	16 Ask your child to give you a "six o'clock report" about what went on today. What's the "lead story"?	17 Start a list of places you'd like to visit. Have your child write letters to obtain information about these places.	18 Ask family members, "If you were an animal, which animal would you be and why?"	19 Help your child make a fruit salad. Include at least one new or unfamiliar fruit.	20 Help your child write a family newsletter. Interview family members and write up the news.	21 Ask your child to tell you about something she loves.
22 With your child, cut out newspaper pictures. Write about what you think happened before or after the picture.	23 Check out a book about a career.	24 Open an atlas and point to a page at random. Talk about what people in that country might eat.	25 Teach your child a favorite song from when you were his age.	26 Talk to your child about people she admires. Ask her why she admires them.	27 It's the birthday of Samuel Morse. Send messages to each other in Morse Code.	28 Visit the library. Check out a book about horses.
29 Ask your child to draw a picture of an imaginary garden. How many different colors can she use?	30 Have your child write a poem or story from the point of view of a family pet.	<h1>April 2012</h1>
